PRESIDENT'S REPORT



The season felt as though it started out with a bit of a COVID-19 hangover but quickly escalated to one of the busiest seasons we have had in a while. I would like to start by thanking the Board. It has been another challenging period for the Board with some difficult discussion and decisions having to be made. Their support during this time has been greatly appreciated.

I would also like to thank all of our sponsors who continue to support us. Without our sponsors' support the Club would be unable to provide the

assistance to various internal areas of the Club. Unfortunately, due to the economic climate we were unable to continue with some sponsorships. Fortunately, we were able to become heavily involved in supporting special events. This provided an income for the Club that came close to replacing the revenue from the lost sponsorship. I would like to thank all the members who supported the special events.

Special event support is something the Board will continue to look at being involved in. Yes, the revenue is needed, however these events really increase the Clubs profile within the community, and also get our name out further as people come from all over Perth to participate and are exposed to the SLSC brand.

I would like to thank all of our volunteers who freely give up their time to support

the Club. The Club is a volunteer organisation, it is run and managed by volunteers, so without them, we would not enjoy the fantastic Club that we have. I would specifically like to mention Bec Hughes and her wonderful work getting Nippers ready and running the show with her dedicated Crusaders and fantastic age group managers. Lisa Sertorini and her team of BBQ cooks who week after week do a fantastic job. Sam Lowe and her tireless work behind the scenes regarding Patrol rosters and data input. Graham Shackles, and his droll sense of humour, who just seems to help wherever he can, be it Nippers, Patrols, Crusaders etc. Mark Thomas who continues to

decorate the Club with memorabilia which helps tell our story, just to name a few of our fantastic members. To all of our volunteers who make an individual commitment the Club, thank you.

When I became President, I wanted to focus on three areas, Communication, Governance and Culture. Communication has improved significantly. I would like to thank Anne Evans for making this a reality. Team App is the main platform that the Club communicates through. It is also a portal for members to volunteer to support other activities due to its interactive nature. We will be soon focussing on upgrading and improving



the Club's website, which will further improve our communication.

From a Governance perspective, the Board has been focussing on the development of policies and manuals. The policies provide clarity to the membership on the many different facets of the Club that affects them. The manual is to provide clarity regarding the many processes the Office are required to perform. The manual is also a risk reduction tool, so that should we need to employ office staff, there is a tool to bring them up to speed as quickly as possible without missing tasks that need to be performed. Both have been progressing well and will continue to do so. The updated Club website will also have a member's portal where policies will be easily accessible to the membership. Further improving our governance.

The culture within the Club is fantastic in the majority of areas, but, needs improvement in others. We really do have some of the best people in our Club, both young and old, who go above and beyond the call of duty. True unsung heroes. However, this attitude and approach is not uniform across the Club, and it needs to be. This uniform engagement with the Club from the

members is something that the Board will be focussing on over the coming seasons to provide more people with the opportunity to contribute back to the Club and improve our community. Teamwork divides the task and multiplies the success. Teamwork, in its holistic sense, is where we will head.

The modernisation of the Club awards has borne fruit. The previous Board aligned our awards with those of the SLSWA Awards of Excellence. This Board has embraced this change and I'd like to thank Garry Williams for his assisting with a robust mapping of the old to the new. The modernisation and alignment resulted in 8 members being put forward for the SLSWA Awards of Excellence and 7 becoming finalists, more than the Club has ever had previously. Not only is this confirmation of a good integrated system, but more importantly it's confirmation of the fantastic high calibre of members that we have that deserve recognition at a State level.

We had Mia Bennett and Cole Johns be awarded the Bronze Medallion for Courage - Youth Award at the Coastal Bravery Awards Ceremony. A fitting recognition for their act of bravery in successfully rescuing a father and two

kids swept out to sea in treacherous conditions. And to think that they were 13 years old at the time, which further highlights the calibre of our members.

The café space continues to be a challenge to lease. The Board has been dealing with an interested party for several months and we should secure a tenant shortly. This will be an amazing achievement for the Club and will help transform it. We look forward to being able to announce the tenant shortly. With this space leased, it will also help bring the community together and provide further opportunities for the Club. Thanks to Ian Noorman, Stu Reeves, Ron Wade and Max Hannah for progressing this opportunity.

Friday and Sunday afternoons and evenings are going from strength to strength, I'd like to thank Rene Pollard for the work she has done in achieving this improvement. Opening up the Club with consistency, helps promote us both amongst the members and also the local community, helping break down some of the perceptions and misinformation that some in the community choose to spread regarding the Club. Rene's done an amazing job, but, needs more bar staff and managers to progress it further,

something we'll look at improving and an area where any member over the age of 18 can help and earn an income.

Surf Sports continues to grow, I congratulate Matt Evans and his team for the work they've put into this and supporting Sam Maurice. They had some great results this season and also growth in numbers. With the Aussies being back in Perth for 2022, next season will likely see further growth and be a very exciting season preparing for this event. The Club has a direct involvement with the Aussies as we host the surfing competition at our beach, which is fantastic.

Our trainers did another fantastic job this year getting members qualified in SRC, BNZ, Beach Management, ARTC, Methoxyflurane, IRBC, IRBD and other courses. It's been a busy year and your efforts are appreciated. A benefit of being a trainer is going down to the beach and seeing those people you've trained, continuing to grow and develop the skills you laid the foundation for. I would like to thank Derry Smith and all of our trainers for making this all happen, it's been a great team effort.

Our Woodside Nippers was a success again and I would like to thank Bec

Hughes and all age group managers, water safety coordinators and Nipper Rescue Certificate holders for the great work you have done. Our Nipper numbers were down this year; however, their enthusiasm wasn't. The Starfish Nippers program continued this season which is fantastic and a great way to build on inclusivity and community spirit. The Club has also purchased a beach wheelchair with grant proceeds from Variety - the Children's Charity. Having this wheelchair available for our community will allow mobility impaired people to access and enjoy the beach.

The Club finances are still in very good shape. However, there are many opportunities to preserve our funds through the grants process. There's a lot more we could have achieved if we'd been successful in getting someone to take on Grants this season. We'll be actively looking for someone to take on Grants next season, so that we don't miss out on opportunities. I'd like to thank Ian Norman for his tireless work in making sure the Club received what it was entitled to.

The Board reviewed the 2019-2021 Strategic Plan and found that the fantastic work that the Members and Matt Osborne

put into it are still 100% relevant, as such we've adopted it as the 2021-2023 Strategic Plan. This valuable document helps shape and guide the Club.

It was another big season for our lifesavers. Stu Reeves supported by Sam Lowe and the Patrol Captains all did another fantastic job. Secret Harbour is a true surf lifesaving beach, which makes patrolling it both challenging and rewarding. We've a great group of dedicated lifesavers and I look forward to seeing more join this fantastic Australian tradition and past time next season. Thank you for keeping your fellow members and the general public safe again with no lives lost at the locations we've patrolled.

We look forward to the exciting developments associated with the support we have received from Paul Papalia CSC MLA and the City of Rockingham with regards to upgrades to the sundeck which will result in the sundeck being able to be used far more often and contain a toilet. This is another opportunity to be able to fully realise the true value of our Club rooms and its location.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT



What a great Club. Another season has come and gone and as with all the prior years, it came with its fair share of challenges. Again, the members stood up when required to do so, automatically like a fine-tuned organisation.

With a late AGM after the COVID lockdown, the new Board was elected, and it was time to get back into business.

With Jacqui (Membership Officer) moving on to start a new career, and Trish (Office Coordinator) going on 12 months parental leave (congratulations on the new arrival of Alice), it was time to revamp the office and revamp the office we did.

It took a while to find the right fit, with Jane McCrea joining us as Club Administrator (also covering for Trish as

Office Coordinator) and our long-term member Kim Wade filling the role of Membership Officer. Sarah Lowe would pop in from time to time to support the office when needed.

The team work well together and compliment each other perfectly. The office was reset, with stable open hours that members and the community could rely on. The new season was up-and-running.

A lot goes on in the background of any organisation and our Club is no different. The only issue is for us it must be carried out by volunteers and a massive **thank you for all those that get involved** as without you the Club would not exist.

The Board is the pivotal point of our Club with dedicated members who want to

make a difference and certainly steer the ship. Although some of the areas covered through the journey over a year may not be of interest to you personally I'm sure there are areas that are, or if missed will soon be covered. Being on a strong unbiased Board has been a treat to say the least. The Board along with their committees and a lot of member input have covered a lot of area this year, some of these include:

Café space and what to do with it – Outcome get it leased, after filtering through the interested parties, negotiations were made with a prominent Perth based restaurant looking at signing a 10 year lease and opening a second outlet with us. As I write this report final paperwork has been transferred awaiting signatures.



Replacement of the ice maker on the top floor – A replacement larger ice making machine with smaller blocks was made available, unit was purchased and installed into the top floor bar/servery. Completed.

New cold-water drink fountain – A request to provide a drinking fountain for members to refill or drink from, a stand-alone commercial (plastic based non-corrosive) water fountain with bottle filler, unit has arrived and is to be installed adjacent to the cool room in the wet area.

Supply water will run through the cool room to chill down prior to being refrigerated and filtered.

Replacement trailer for surf boat – It was decided to replace our rusted-

out trailer beneath our blue Konica surf boat so both surf boats could be put back into full use, enabling more members to give this sport a go. Ordered. Projects in the pipeline and coming soon.

Replacement sweep fans for top floor bar/servery area – Awaiting council approval to replace existing air circulation fans that have melted, with new stainless-steel units completely corrosion resistant and commercial grade.

New air-conditioning and exhaust ventilation for top floor bar/servery area – As noted above, the extreme heat generated in the top floor bar/servery area is putting extreme loads on our refrigeration systems,

ice machines and stock. Fully automatic exhaust ventilation to circulate the air in through the door and out the roof when internal temperatures rise, whilst the servery is closed and locked up, along with air conditioning for staff whilst in use. Awaiting funds and council approval.

New windbreak panel system top floor – With the success of the continuous Friday Night Sundowner and Sunday Arvo Sessions, the top floor is now coming into its own, to be able to extend the time we can use this magnificent area of our Club will make for excellent returns financially, and the enjoyment of our Club shared with the community. Awaiting funding and council approval.



New panel fill-ins top floor eastern end –
With the uptake and use of the top floor, the risk of people/children sitting/crawling on the eastern end yellow drinks shelf has become more prominent. Although wire guarding was installed and then raised at that end, we are looking at replacing this with panels to remove any chance of an incident. Awaiting funding and council approval.

The Board has been seriously looking at the longevity of our Club over the past year. Our existing Club Strategic Plan 2019 – 2021 was still very much alive and current and to be focused on for another two years 2021 – 2023, where once again the Board at the time should reassess.

We are looking at implementing tools to make the Club become financially independent, like long term tenancy in the café space along with the gym, patrol revenues, fundraisers like Containers for Change, venue hire agreements, and taking a much more proactive approach

to grants and sponsorships available along with increasing the Club overall usage.

Bringing the community back to the Club, with an attractive social membership, inviting locals to enjoy our socialising events, like Friday sundowner and Sunday Arvo sessions, soon to come special nights along with the food vans making an application to reside down the Club's end of the car park for their monthly visits.

But most importantly getting all members involved, it's great to see so many nippers, junior and youth smiling faces, as a lot of parents just drop them off or sit and sip a coffee looking at their phones or general chit chat amongst themselves until an activity is over to take their little ones home again.

However, the Club is a lot more than that; so getting involved in the water, or if that is not for you, getting involved with a dry activity is the best way to get the most out of our Club. This is where the magic

begins - meeting and sharing with each other. Just ask those that are involved - they are there as volunteers doing it every week; not for money but for the enjoyment of seeing each other achieve more.

It has been an interesting and challenging year to say the least, and the time between Board reports is short. It has also been a rewarding year as items slowly work out into fruition and reality.

I look forward to many more active members joining the Board and committees, new faces joining the Club, and the stories and the adventures as we save lives, protect the beach, and become the strong Club we always are **Team Secrets**.

I thank you all for this opportunity within our great Club.

LIFESAVING REPORT

Lifesaving Season 2020/21 started whilst still coming out of the severe restrictions imposed by COVID-19 earlier in the year. Our normal winter training for Bronze Medallion, IRB Crew and Driver training wasn't allowed to occur so we were short in some patrols and

down a Patrol Captain. Brendan Privilege (Club President) came out of (patrol) retirement, quickly completed his Silver Medallion in Beach Management, and became the Patrol Captain for Patrol 8. The Club's training team did an excellent job of catching up and graduating a significant number of qualified lifesavers

and IRB Operators during the season and I cannot thank them enough for putting in some extraordinary hours to make this happen. This is especially so when many of them have other roles and patrol commitments in the Club as well. We had an excellent group of experienced lifesavers on the beach that

were the backbone of the patrols. The Patrol Captains, all seasoned hands, were backed up well by some good Vice Patrol Captains.

As well as patrols at Secret Harbour, we also completed five patrols for abalone fishing. This is one more than previous years and with a continuing expansion and professionalisation of these patrols. Whilst lead by the senior members, the youth and young adults make up the bulk of these patrols and it is great to see them all turn up for the brief at Mersey Point so early in the morning ready to go. Thank you also to the many parents that get up early to get the junior members there on time. The drones have been used successfully at Penguin Island this year with a successful rescue initiated by the Drone Team. The Club earned a considerable sum from these patrols some of which will be reinvested into the special Abalone Patrol equipment and the remainder into general patrol gear.

Garry Williams did another excellent job of organising of the watercraft and special equipment used in these patrols along with the Crusaders.

We also completed a number of water safety activities for various community events. These ranged from the Swimming WA open water swim at Rockingham Foreshore (with excellent support from Mandurah SLSC) to local sporting and school groups. We were able to support schools that were located away from the coastal areas including the Kewdale Campus of the Australian Islamic College. These events gave us the opportunity to reinforce the lifesaving safety messages

to groups that may not hear them otherwise. Thanks to Brendan Privilege for organising (and participating in) most of these events. Some of these events also brought in much needed revenue for the Club to support our lifesaving and other activities. Whilst we don't normally charge small or low budget community groups, several of their managers insisted on making donations to the Club as they felt our work is important and wanted to help us. It brought it home to me how highly surf lifesaving is regarded in the community.

The Patrol Tower was moved to its current position north of the access track early in the season and this has increased this asset's functionality especially on cooler and very windy days. Feedback from the Patrol Captains indicate the Patrol Shelter still has a place in the patrols, so both are now used on the beach. Under Iain Lund's direction, a number of trials for running the patrols differently were put in place during the 2019/20 Season and, whilst extending out to 10 patrols (with the aim of reducing the number of patrols for each member)

stretched our resources, the adoption of dedicated days for patrols (for example, only Sundays for Patrol 5) and standard patrol hours were viewed favourably and adopted as standard practice for the 2020/21 season. Good support from the Patrol Captains assisted in developing several new policies from radio operation to patrol obligations and these are now being finalised ready for publishing before next season.

The number of members requesting to be included within the Supplementary List reduced markedly this year and this may be a combination of coincidence as well as COVID-19 travel restrictions. This situation made the creation of the patrol roster easier than in previous years. We will need to see how we fare next season noting the likelihood of most travel restrictions being lifted by then.

The challenge of ensuring members meet their patrol obligations has continued to be difficult with members completing their full patrol requirements reducing this season. Patrol hours were down from last year by approximately 11%. Some

of this probably couldn't be helped due to the heavy catch up training load and limited number of members available to be patrol substitutes. This is something we are aware of but the answers to the problem aren't clear yet and requires further work within the Lifesaving Committee and Board of Management. Water safety hours increased by over 44%.

The number of rescues for the year was 45, which was down considerably from last year. This is likely to be from the milder weather and COVID-19 restrictions suppressing the number of people on the beach swimming and surfing.

The Lifesaving portfolio is big and requires a lot of work mainly during the lifesaving season but also in the off season to prepare for next year. There is no way I could do it on my own and I don't need to because I have a fantastic team working alongside me. Thank you to:

Sam Lowe (Patrol Officer), Mark Turley (IRB Officer), Garry Williams (Jet skis and Vehicles Officer), Jo Thodis and Lorry Rule (First Aid Officers) and Joe Ford (Drone Officer).

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Committee have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the financial reporting requirements of the members.

The financial report covers Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. as an individual entity. Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is an association incorporated in Western Australia under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB'), as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities under the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporations Act 2015.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs. The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Accounting Policies

(a) **Income Tax**

The Association has obtained tax-exempt status under current Australian Taxation legislation.

(b) **Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined by the purchase price of the inventories.

(c) **Property, Plant and Equipment**

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses (if any).

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

(c) **Property, Plant and Equipment (CONT'D)**

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of motor vehicles and other assets is depreciated on a reducing balance basis.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
First aid room equipment	10% to 20%
Merchandise and Office equipment	10% to 100%
Rescue, Training and Comp equipment	10% to 100%
Social hall, bar and canteen	10% to 100%
Building	10% to 100%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each balance date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the income statement.

(d) **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and cash at banks.

(e) **Revenue**

Revenue from donations and Interest revenue are recognised upon receipt of the funds.

Grants received for recurrent expenditures and member's subscriptions are recorded as income in the year in which they are earned.

Revenue from sale of goods (trading income) is recognised when the control of goods is passed to members/customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(f) **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.



- The Sound Telegraph:** For featuring our stories, providing the club with valuable publicity.
- Charter Hall:** For providing space at Secret Harbour Square for our members



to promote surf lifesaving and fundraise for the club.

— **Channel 9 Perth:** For their ongoing partnership, engaging members and the wider community with live broadcasts and the 9 Street Team on location at the club.

— **Mandurah SES:** For allowing the club to use their bus to transport groups of members to training, development camps and other essential club activities.

— **Marine Rescue Rockingham:** For assisting with Rock Rescue and Search and Rescue Training.

— **R&K Wade Plumbing, Drainage & Gas Fitting:** For their many in-kind donations.

— **Williams Family:** For funding Gold rewards for our Youth Engagement Program.

Like other areas of the club's operations, COVID-19 has impacted sponsorships with some of our supporters having to unfortunately pause or cease their valued contributions. However there are some good news stories here which demonstrate the commitment our sponsors have to the surf lifesaving movement and to our club.

Firstly, I'd like to thank Channel Nine Perth for their generous support of Secret Harbour SLSC over many years. After experiencing a significant disruption in the media sector during 2020, we've now moved to a non-monetary partnership, with Nine Perth committed to providing

broadcasting related opportunities like 9 Street Team Activations and other activities to be developed. We are very grateful to have their ongoing partnership.

The Club's major sponsors provide invaluable support to the club, enabling us to maintain key deliverables year on year:

The City of Rockingham continues their long-standing support of our club and the services we provide to the community.

Rockingham Toyota's sponsorship is now in its second season, with their donation of a new rescue ute proving to be an indispensable asset to our lifesaving operations. The Toyota Hilux Surf Rescue vehicle is an important and reliable

fixture of our patrol service, ensuring we are rescue ready at all times. The ute is regularly used in the community to facilitate training, search and rescue operations, transporting lifesaving equipment and enables roving patrols along one of Australia's longest patrolled stretches of coastline. It's also a fixture on the beach during our Nippers program, with our lifesavers of the future proudly sporting Rockingham Toyota's logo on their high-vis vests.

Alcoa's continued support of Starfish Nippers and Crusaders/Cadets has made a significant impact to the youth of our community with the running of these important programs.

Paul Papalia CSC MLA, our club co-patron and long-standing supporter, will provide

the Club with \$120,000 to be used towards enclosing our rooftop function centre, upgrading the bathroom facilities and replacing our aging patrol shelter. This generous funding will greatly benefit our local community, club members and enhance our surf lifesaving operations.

PR & COMMUNICATIONS

Our public relations and communications strategy has centred around the two key focus areas this season: Streamlining our internal communications and expanding our reach in the community via external channels.

Team App was launched as the official club communications application after evaluating its use among other surf clubs and notably, Surf Life Saving WA who use

the app as a portal for their Surf Sports communications. Team App can be used by members as both a smartphone and desktop app or as a simple email/notification service, depending on the user's preference. The app is cost-effective and enables the club to have a central portal for club news, events, training, documents and other key info. We will continue to monitor its use and efficacy for our members in order to provide an efficient communications function, aiming to reduce club news being distributed across too many channels. SurfGuard continues to be used as the club's official email distribution service.

We also launched an e-newsletter distribution using MailerLite, a cost-effective and visually appealing email



marketing program with good branding capabilities.

To further reach our members and broader community, we have expanded our use of social media and are now operating six social media accounts (Facebook/Instagram) across three distinct areas: General Club, Social Club and Weddings/Functions. Each account has a defined purpose, audience and format to suit the different functions, but all share the common brand and voice of our surf club. We have also just launched a LinkedIn Page to connect with our community of current and potential external stakeholders, and provide our members with an official business page to link their volunteer experience within their personal profiles.

User engagement and followers, particularly on our General Club accounts

which have been the primary focus, has increased month after month with over 3,000 followers on Facebook and 1,180 on Instagram, after hitting our first key Instagram milestone of 1k back in November!

Social Media remains a very cost-effective and powerful marketing and communications tool for our club and provides great exposure for our sponsors with the ability to promote and acknowledge their brands to a significant and relevant audience. We will soon be upgrading our website to round out our digital footprint.

I'd like to thank the following members for getting out in the community during the month of December to shake a tin for the annual BeachSAFE appeal: Nicola Awang, Lochie Gray, Montana Hicks, Dave McCarron, Lorry Rule and Del Rule. The street appeal, combined with our

first ever Online Giving Day raised \$548 for the club. We'd love to have even more members take part next year and help grow our fundraising efforts – it's a lot of fun and great way to meet the community.

I'd also like to thank the following members for thier invaluable assistance and support this season: Jane McCrea, Kim Wade, Greg Stroot, Sam Lowe, Kate Crockett, Joe Ford, Carolyn Wilson, and the Board of Management team.

There is always so much happening at the club that we'd like to share more broadly via our communications channels, so we welcome our members to provide content to help tell the story of our club and its greatest asset: our dedicated volunteers.

STARFISH NIPPERS

We'd like to extend a big thank you to our sponsor, Alcoa, for enabling us to run a third, successful season of the Starfish Nippers program. Starfish Nippers is a modified Nippers program for children with special needs.

This season we commenced Starfish Nippers in January 2021 to allow for improved weather, we had 11 Starfish Nippers enroll in the program, six of them were returning Nippers, and three have been in the program from the beginning. We started out by sending a welcome pack and doing an individual meet and greet with the kids and families before the Sunday sessions kicked off. This was a great chance to meet the kids, give them their Starfish Nippers pack and to make sure we knew the families' expectations and what we could offer them matched to make for an easy season.

We had over 10 Bronze trained volunteers assist with the program delivery to ensure one-on-one water safety and the parents were wonderful at getting involved with the activities. We ran our program week to week on a routine of meet and greet, attend Woodside Nippers morning notices, then warm up, walk to the beach via water safety sign, look at the conditions from the raised wooden deck, then a visit to the patrol shelter to meet the patrol captain and get a welcome and education session with them; including signals, where to swim, radios etc.

In the water we worked as a group, focusing on building safe beach practices and building confidence through fun water and beach surf sports and lifesaving style activities. The Nippers enjoyed boards and many built their confidence with diving under waves. We felt there was such great success, at least four of the Starfish Nippers will be integrated into Woodside Nippers in the next season. The Starfish Nippers did participate in two whole Club youth activities, those being the Have A Go Carnival and the end of season wind up, both were successful and great fun.

At the end of the season (eight weeks) there was great camaraderie between the Nippers and families and volunteers from the Club, and a resounding positive attitude towards returning next year.

CRUSADERS CORNER



Well, what a year! After the birth of the Crusaders, now 8 years ago, our numbers involved in our Club-based Youth Engagement Program (YEP) have continued to increase with us now consistently having over 100 U14-U19s engaged in the program.

Out of the one hundred and fifteen 13-19 year old Crusaders registered for the season, we had 89 Crusaders patrol, providing some 2,557 hours. The Crusaders supported patrols, Abalone patrols, water safety, community fairs, safety expos and other community events.

The Crusaders commitment again this season has been outstanding. In particular, we had 13 Crusaders all patrol over 50 hrs and 3 over 80 hrs in Patrick and Riley Walsh and Jack Stirling which is an absolutely awesome commitment.

A number of the Crusaders are Age Managers, Assistant Managers, Office Bearers of the Club, and new Trainers. Many are mentors to the younger Nippers and to their peers. Some have competed at the highest-level competition and some have been acknowledged as

evolving leaders. Some have been awarded Coastal Bravery Awards for outstanding acts of Bravery—Cole Johns and Mia Bennett were awarded the Bronze Medallion for Courage for their part in the rescue of two children and an adult caught in a rip at Secret Harbour.

We also have some Finalists in this year's awards of excellence in Nicolas Graydon—Youth Lifesaver of the Year, and both Mitchell Shackles and Lewis Harrison in the Young Volunteer of the Year category. Outstanding!

A couple have taken up the opportunity to participate in the new SLSWA Youth Leaders Program with two members gaining their Gold; Jasmine Noorman (last season but due to COVID





was not recognised formally) and Tayla Jones with others almost at the Gold Level and others working on their Silver.

We have had a huge amount of fun over the years, with this year being no exception. We started with our first outing at the Wake Park in October, IRB/RWC famils, IRB Awards, held a number of exercises with Marine Rescue Rockingham, completed our SRC/BNZ/IRBC Crew development Program that finished with the SRC/Bronze Camp sleepover, and surfing lessons—thanks Harry Collins, who conducted Abalone Patrols and Famils, and Rock Rescue Famils. While we didn't get to our Crusaders Camp at Legacy in Busselton due to COVID restrictions—we did kick off our inaugural Crusaders Big Day Out at Secret Harbour.

We also have kicked off our fourth season of IRB Competition—Go the IRBIVORS! Unfortunately, due to COVID-19, we didn't get to complete as many activities as we had hoped but we still did heaps—roll on next season!

We kicked off our Crusaders Big Day Out at Secret Harbour, with over 50 Crusaders attending. The day was about having a go—we rowed surf boats, boarded the Marine Rescue Vessel Cape Peron just off our beach via IRB and RWC, we had a surfing lesson, participated in a Drone information session and first aid challenges in the afternoon. The day concluded with the presentation of our SRC/BNZ and IRB awards and recognition of our newest Crusaders in the new U14 group with the presentation of their Crusaders jumpers—followed by pizza and a movie.

Over the course of the season the Crusaders have been working towards their SRCs, Bronze, IRB Crew, Trainers and our YEPs rewards of Bronze, Silver and Gold by engaging in patrols, development activities and in Surf Sports.

This year we had fifteen progress with their BNZ, twenty six their SRCs, and thirteen Crewies. Huge effort team! We also qualified seven IRBDs! Tayla Jones, Harry Collins, Ben Wade, Jasmine Noorman, Mitchell Shackles and Riley and Patrick Walsh.

For our older Crusaders we have had Tayla, Jasmine, Patrick and Riley complete their WA trainers with Mitchell just awaiting final sign off.

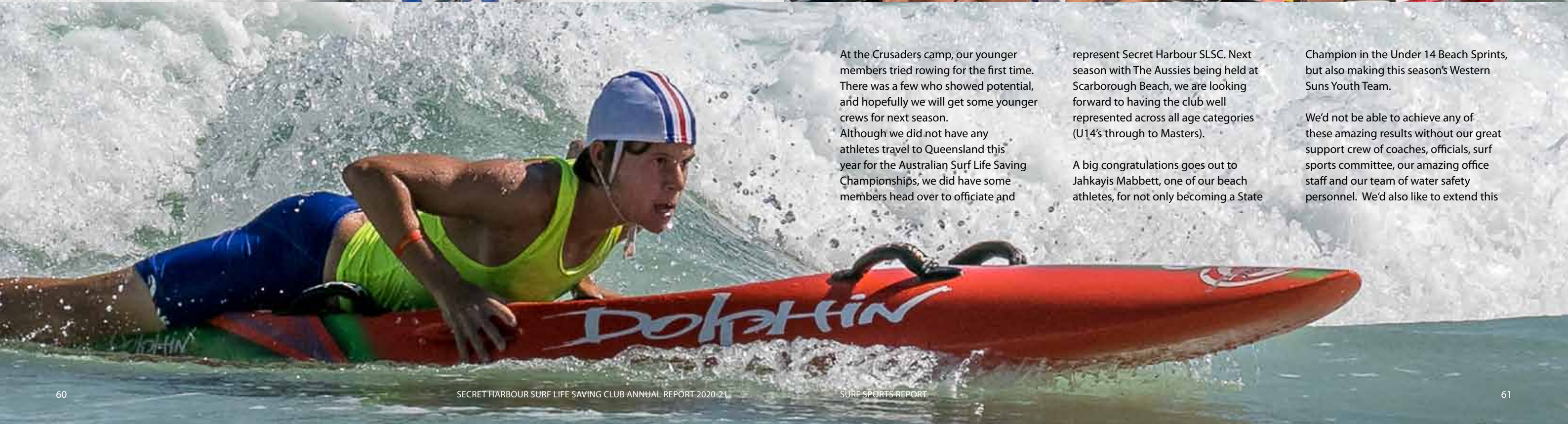
972 points. Points aside, we came away with a lot of great results across all age categories.
