6.0 Building Project.

Club Member and Chair of the Building Upgrade Committee Max Hannah & Ashley Pittard (Manager, Community Infrastructure Planning) from the City of Rockingham presented a report on the SHSLSC redevelopment Project to the membership.

 - November 2014 - Contract awarded and Construction commences Stage 1 - Toilets demolished Stage 2 - Pavilion constructed Stage 3 –
 - Spring 2015 - Move and Clubhouse demolished
- Other projects to accompany building project
 - Car Park Lighting - North
 - Upgrade Poles and LED lighting during 2014/2015

16.0 **Other Business**

16.1 **Constitution and By Law Review**

Garry Williams on behalf of the club Constitutional & By Law review committee presented an update on the process of the review. Members were advised the draft documents were now available from the club website to review.

In summary:

- The new constitution template was developed by Surf Lifesaving in conjunction with legal firm Landers and Rogers to assist clubs in remaining consistent with the requirements of the Associations Act.
- The Objectives (Clause 2) are many and are specifically listed in to ensure our position as a not for profit organisation.

The main drivers for the constitution change were to:

- Meet the desire for SRC members to have the power to vote. I would ask you all to consider the definition of 'full member' as this is the key to the power to vote; and
- To allow the alignment of our membership categories to SLSA (refer Clause 11).

The following of other areas have been brought into line with SLSA regulations:

- Clause 17 - Grievances/Judicial process is referred to the SLSA Regulations and moved from the Constitution to the By-laws
- Clause 29.3 - There has been a change in the Minimum and Maximum terms of Board Members
- Our Club Colours and logo have shifted to the By-laws.

By Laws have been made to reflect the new constitution with much of the information being transferred from the current constitution to the By-laws.

The areas affected are:

- Section 5.1 e & f fundraising to general revenue - most is taken from the current constitution
- Section 6 Grievances Judicial and Discipline- Now mirrors SLSA process and procedure
- Section 12 Membership Categories now reflect those of SLSA
- Section 12.1.1 Life Membership becomes an appointment by the board in consideration of recommendation received from a life membership committee rather than elected at an AGM
- Section 14 Some structure around members travelling out of the state for events associated with club activities.
- A number of small changes in grammar and minor word changes have been made.

Additionally our club values have been aligned to those of SLS and that an amendment process has been included with a notification period of 30 days for members to comment on those changes. This removes the requirement to have them ratified at the AGM. Members are protected against any unconstitutional changes to the By-laws under clause 30 of the Draft Constitution.

The draft has been to SLWA twice for comment.

Garry Williams was thanked for his work and feedback.

Club member Sharee Hart requested that in reviewing the club Bylaws that consideration be given to expanding the parameters of to allow for recognition of service from committee work or other volunteer services:

Section 7.6 patrols, part e, of Club By Laws Volume 1:

e. In the event that members do not complete the required number of patrols then 'Incomplete Service' shall be recorded in the Register of Patrol Service for that season unless the member is a Life Member, Long Service Member or is on the Supplementary List as approved by the Director of Life Saving.

It was noted the role of Pool Rescue Coach would be added to the By Laws. This will be considered at the August meeting of the Board of Management.

16.2 Strategic Plan

The club Strategic Plan is currently being updated and coordinated to be compatible with SLSWA & SLSA. Black Point Consulting will be assisting the club with the strategic plan. Wendy Malcolm will be developing this process and will take this forward.

16.3 On behalf of the membership Max Hannah thanked the Board for their work, expertise and guidance through the season and all the members for what has arguably been one of the clubs most successful seasons to date.
